Due to Yom Kippur being a fast day, no refreshments will be served. The obligation to fast is superseded by the Jewish value of “*vachai bahem*” – *You shall live by them (the commandments)*, such that in the event an individual has underlying medical conditions that would make it unsafe to fast, one may not fast.
